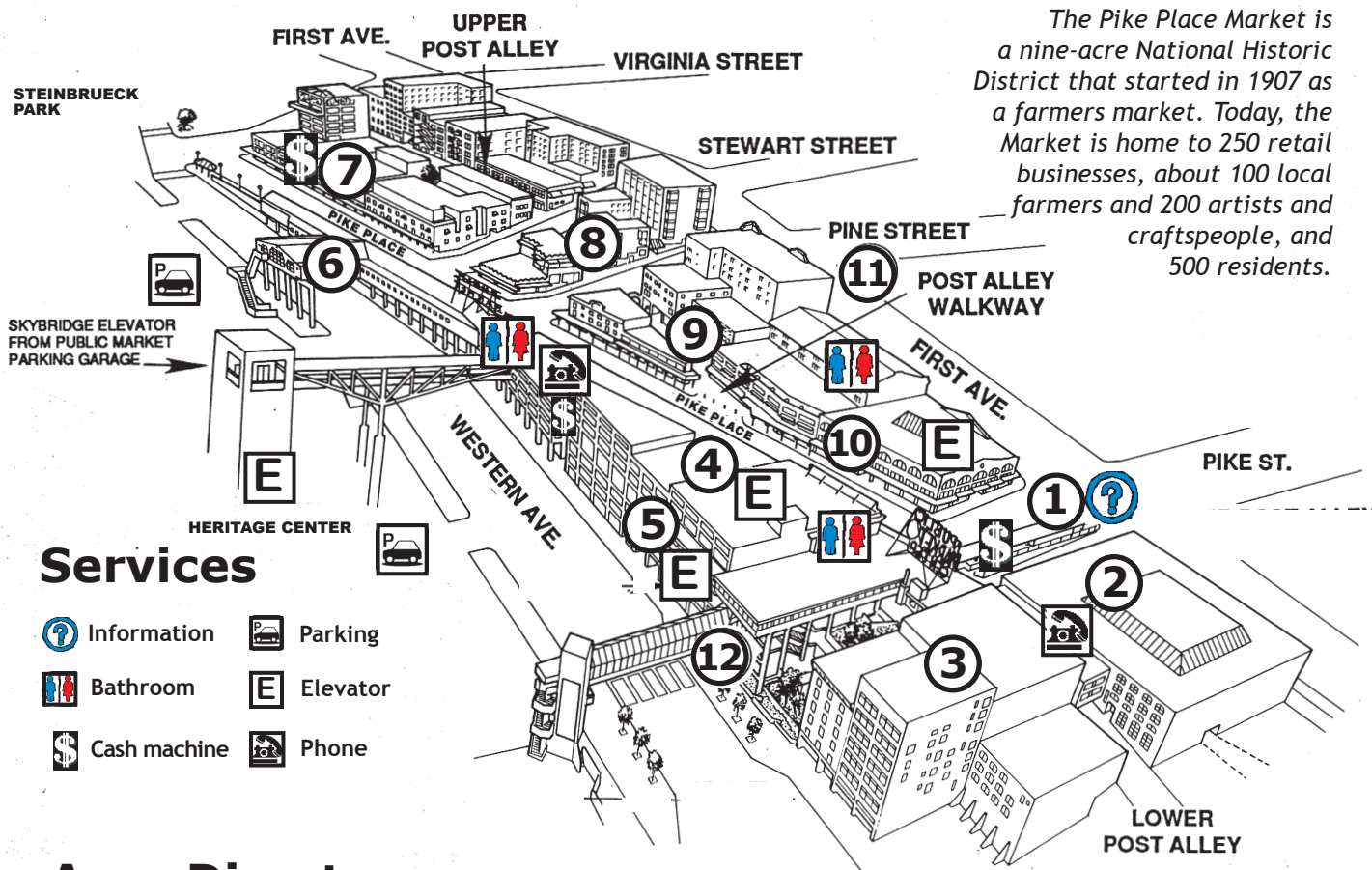








Welcome to the Pike Place Market

The Pike Place Market is a nine-acre National Historic District that started in 1907 as a farmers market. Today, the Market is home to 250 retail businesses, about 100 local farmers and 200 artists and craftspeople, and 500 residents.

Area Directory

- 1** The Market's main entrance at First and Pike features an **Information Booth** and cash machine. Stop here for directions and information.
- 2** The **Economy Market Building** is home to a collection of small shops, a newsstand, and an international grocery market. The upper floor has offices and a dentist.
- 3** The **LaSalle/Cliff House** buildings contain shops, restaurants, and apartments.
- 4** A food lover's dream, the **Main Arcade** features fish, meat, produce, and local farmers or craftspeople stalls. Restaurants offer Market or water views.
- 5** Don't miss **DownUnder** and **Western Ave**: four levels of collectible and antique shops, specialty shops, bookstores, and several restaurants.
- 6** The **North Arcade** and the **Desimone Bridge** feature local farmers with farm fresh produce, value added products, and beautiful bouquets, as well as artists and craftspeople who make one-of-a-kind artwork.
- 7** Between **Stewart** and **Virginia Streets** are small specialty shops, restaurants, and residences.
- 8** The little block between **Stewart** and **Pine Streets** is home to a hotel and several specialty shops.
- 9** **Post Alley** splits off from **Pike Place** at this point, and runs alongside the **Triangle Building**. This pedestrian walkway features shops and eateries.
- 10** The **Corner Market**, **Sanitary Market**, and **Post Alley Market** are connected by interior passageways leading to specialty stores, bakeries, eateries, and more. There's a new elevator in the **Corner Market Building** and new public restrooms in the **Sanitary Market**.
- 11** **First Avenue** is home to restaurants, cafes, a travel store, and other shops.
- 12** The **Hillclimb Corridor** offers access to each **DownUnder** level and connects the Market to the waterfront.
